Proverbs 3:5-6

"But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."





John 3:16

This verse isn't just the gospel in a nutshell—it's your personal invitation to receive love, grace, and eternal life. Don't let familiarity steal its power. Let these words remind you today: you are deeply, eternally loved.

Lamentations 3:22-23

"The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness."

"If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault..."


